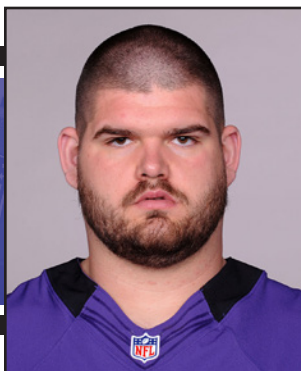

Jeff Braun signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13...A three-year starter, he appeared in 50 games (39 starts) at West Virginia...Selected as a All-Big 12 honorable mention honoree, during his senior season...Helped the Mountaineers rush for 2,556 yards on 461 attempts and 21 TDs...Saw action in 942 offensive plays...Aided in protecting QB Geno Smith by allowing only 22 sacks (-139 yards)...Led the O-line with 62 knockdowns...WVU finished the season allowing only 13 turnovers...Opened the 2012 campaign helping the offense amass 331 rushing yards on 35 carries in a win over Marshall...Blocked for sophomore RB Andrew Buie, who led the team in rushing with 914 yards on 179 carries with 7 TDs...Started every game at LG during the 2011 season...Allowed only 1 sack...Ranked third on the offensive line after seeing action in 912 snaps...Helped pave the way for the WVU offense to average 37.6 points per game...Aided the offense in producing more than 4,500 passing yards and more than 6,100 total yards...Saw action on 70 or more plays in five games...Tallied 52 knockdowns, the second-best mark on the team...Went on to record at least 5 knockdowns in five games...Started all 13 games at RT during his 2010 season...Was named third-team All-Big East by *Phil Steele*...Awarded WVU Offensive Champion for his performance in its win against Cincinnati...Assisted the run game in producing 2,481 rushing yards and 18 TDs...During his redshirt-freshman season in 2009, he played in 11 games...Was used as a backup at center and guard throughout the season when the offense amassed 29 rushing TDs and allowed only 24 sacks...Graduated in Dec. 2012 with a regents bachelors of arts degree...Was awarded Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll, Big East Academic All-Star honors and Athletic Director's Academic Honor Roll mention...Prepped at Winters Mill (Westminster, MD) HS...Was a 2007 Maryland consensus All-State selection by the *Associated Press*...Started at center and on the D-Line for three years...Finished his prep tenure with 127 tackles, 7 sacks, 4 PD and 2 FRs.

Jose Cheeseborough signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13...Started every game at FIU after beginning his collegiate career at Edward Waters College in 2010 (38 games)...In his three-year stint at FIU, he recorded 152 tackles, 1 INT, 2 sacks (-23 yards), 1 FF, 2 FRs and 9 PD...Tied for the second-most career starts (38) at CB at FIU...During his senior season in 2012, he earned All-Sun Belt Conference honorable mention...Served as one of the Panthers' captains and compiled 54 tackles, 1 INT, 5 PD and 1 FR...Started all 13 games and posted 59 tackles, 3 TFL (-31 yards), 2 sacks (-25 yards) and 3 PD as a junior in 2011...Contributed to a defense that ranked 13th in pass efficiency and 14th in scoring defense...Collected a season-high 8 tackles vs. Troy and 7 tackles in three other contests...Began his first season at FIU with 13 starts in 2010...Was one of only six players on the team that started each contest...Finished the season with 49 tackles, 1.5 TFL, 4 PD and 1 FF...Returned a recovered fumble 4 yards in the season opener...Posted a season-best 8 tackles in a win over Western Kentucky...Had a season-best 7 solo tackles in a victory over Troy...Redshirted in 2009 after transferring from Edward Waters in 2008...Graduated with a degree in criminal justice...Prepped at Robert E. Lee (Jacksonville, FL) HS...Played football and basketball all four years...Saw action at corner, safety and wingback...Participated in track his freshman and sophomore years, running the 110 meter hurdles and 300 meter hurdles...Reached the final four basketball tournament as a junior in 2007.

Brandon Copeland signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13...Three-time Ivy League Champion, he finished his collegiate tenure playing in 39 games (30-straight starts), tallying 160 tackles (90 solo), 11 sacks (-70 yards), 26.5 TFL, 1 INT, 4 PD, 2 FFs, 2 FRs, 1 blocked kick, 1 safety and 1 TD...Earned first-team All-Ivy League three times (2010-12)...Capped off his collegiate career in 2012, earning first-team All-Ivy League by tallying 51 tackles (26 solo)...Led the team and finished seventh in the league with 5 sacks (-23 yards) and recorded 8.5 TFL, ranking second on the team...Placed third in the league with 2 FRs...Posted 5-or-more tackles during six contests, with a season-high 8 tackles against William & Mary and Columbia...In a win over Columbia, he blocked his first FG...Was awarded Ivy League Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors and NCAA National Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in a win against Harvard, where he helped clinch the Ivy League with his first safety and a career-high 2 sacks...During his junior season in 2011, he earned first-team All-Ivy and *Lindy's* second-team All-America...In 10 starts, Copeland recorded 51 tackles (31 solo), ranking second on the team...Also ranked fourth on the team with 6 TFL and 2 sacks as a junior...Scored his first TD against Dartmouth when returning a fumble to win the game...Collected a season-high 9 tackles on two occasions...Helped lead the Quakers to a 9-1 overall record as a sophomore in 2010 by starting all 10 games and finishing with first-team All-Ivy League honors...Had at least 1 tackle in every game, tallying 45 tackles (27 solo), placing fifth on the team...Ended up fifth in the league with a team-high 10 TFL and also posted 3 sacks (-22 yards)...Had his first INT in a win at Yale...In an OT victory over Dartmouth, he collected a season-best 9 tackles...Posted 8 tackles in a win during the title-clinching game against Harvard...Saw action in the final nine games of the season as a freshman...Collected 13 tackles (6 solo), 2 TFL, 1 FR and 1 sack (-9 yards)...Collected his first-career sack in a win against Yale...Majored in management with a specialization in entrepreneurship...Prepped at Gilman School (Baltimore, MD), where he was a three-sport athlete in football, basketball and track...Was awarded the 2008 National Football Foundation Scholar Athlete of the Year award and was a 2008 Academic All-State team honoree...Participated in Maryland Crab Bowl and the Baltimore Touchdown Club All-Star games in 2008...Was a member of the 2006 MIAAA Conference championship squad...Nominated for the Army All-American game and earned All-Baltimore City honors...Grandfather Roy Hilton played 11 years in the NFL (Atlanta Falcons, NY Giants and Baltimore Colts) and appeared in Super Bowl III and Super Bowl V.

Jordan Devey signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13...Started all 24 games of his two-year career with the Tigers, playing on every snap, which included 1,558 plays...Started and appeared in both guard and tackle positions on both sides of the offensive line throughout his career...Started at LG for the East team at the 2013 East-West Shrine Game...Started all 12 games (10 at LT and two at LG) with Memphis as a senior in 2012, serving as a member of head coach Justin Fuente's Leadership Council...Named second-team All-Conference USA and earned the Tigers' DeAngelo Williams Most Valuable Player Award...Also selected to *Phil Steele's* Postseason All-Conference USA second team...Started the first five games of the season at LT...Played in three different positions (LT, LG and RG) in victories over Rice and UAB...Appeared in more than 70 plays four times during the season, including a season-high 84 plays against Marshall...Blocked for a ground game that averaged 151.8 yards per contest and scored 18 rushing TDs...Scored the only TD of his career after recovering a RB Jai Steib fumble in the end zone at Marshall...Started all 12 games (five at RT, one at RG and six at LT) as a junior in 2011 after transferring to Memphis from Snow College (Ephraim, UT)...Played in all 786 snaps of the season, appearing in 60 or more snaps in eight contests...Played a career-high 87 snaps in his first collegiate start against Mississippi State...Played for two seasons (2009-10) at Snow College...Transitioned to LT in 2010 and was named the team's Offensive Player of the

Year, while earning All-Region and All-Conference honors...Recorded 37 "pancake" blocks and did not allow a sack that season, while the offense averaged more than 40 points per game...Also blocked for two QBs that each surpassed the 1,200-yard mark and helped the Snow Badgers' RBs record 10 100-yard performances en route to a 10-2 record and a victory in the Top of the Mountains Bowl...Started every game at LG during his freshman campaign in 2009...Majored in accounting...Attended American Fork (UT) HS, where he did not play football after suffering from Osgood-Schlatter Disease in junior high...Participated in baseball for the Cavemen...Turned down several music scholarships after performing as a tuba player in the high school band in order to serve a two-year LDS church mission in Costa Rica...**Last name pronounced: DEH-vee.**

EXP. (NFL/RAVENS): Rookie

Matt Furstenburg signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13...Appeared in 51 career games (35 starts) with the Terrapins, recording 60 receptions for 769 yards and 5 TDs...Was a three-year starter at TE, excelling not only in the receiving game but as a blocker...Named first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference by *Athlon*, *Blue Ribbon*, *Lindy's* and *Phil Steele*... Played in 12 contests (11 starts) as a senior in 2012, posting 16 receptions for 206 yards and 2 TDs...Recorded a season-high 4 receptions for 65 yards at West Virginia...Hauled in 2 catches for 29 yards and 1 TD in the season finale at North Carolina... Appeared in and started all 12 contests as a junior in 2011, when he recorded 31 of his 60 career receptions and was named to the John Mackey Award midseason watch list...Finished the campaign fourth on the team with 31 catches for 348 yards and 2 TDs...Was third among TEs in the ACC in receptions (2.6 per game) and receiving yards (29.0 ypg)...Had a career-high 7 receptions for 70 yards against West Virginia, the most catches by a Terrapin's TE since 2008 (Joey Haynos - 8)...Had a career-best 104 receiving yards on 5 receptions with a career-high 2 TDs, including a season-long 40-yard TD grab, against Clemson...It marked the most single-game receiving yards by a Maryland TE since 2005 (Vernon Davis - 108)...Played in all 13 games (11 starts) as a sophomore in 2010, hauling in 12 receptions for 206 yards and 1 TD...Averaged a team-best 17.2 yards per catch...Had 3 receptions for 48 yards and his first-career TD against Morgan State...Set season highs with 5 catches for 98 yards against Clemson, including a career-long 53-yard reception...Appeared in 11 games (one start) as a redshirt freshman in 2009, recording 1 catch for 9 yards...Also saw action on special teams...Started the season opener against California...Caught his first-career pass for 9 yards against Rutgers...Played in two contests as a freshman in 2008 on special teams and did not play the remainder of the season after suffering an ankle injury...Attended The Hun School (Princeton, NJ) in 2007 prior to enrolling at Maryland, where he helped lead the Raiders to a 9-0 record, the team's first undefeated season since 1991...Earned a degree in family science from Maryland...Prepped at Hunterdon Central Regional (Flemington, NJ) HS...Was named a four-star recruit by *Scout.com*...Earned All-State and All-County honors as a senior in 2006 after recording 28 catches for 400 yards and 4 TDs...Also produced 76 tackles and 8 sacks on defense, helping the Red Devils to a 9-3 finish en route to the 2006 State Championship...Also lettered in lacrosse, earning All-State and honorable mention All-America selections and helping lead the Red Devils to three-consecutive state titles (2005-07).

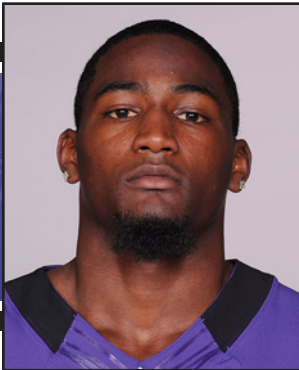

Rogers Gaines signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13... Played in 30 games (18 starts) during his four-year career along the Tigers' O-line... Appeared in and started eight games as a senior in 2012, earning a first-team All-Ohio Valley Conference honors as well as *Associated Press* first-team and *The Sports Network* second-team All-American accolades... Gaines did not allow a sack on the season and graded out at 93.6 percent... Was part of an O-line that finished fourth in the OVC in rushing (175.7 ypg)... Helped block for RB Trabis Ward, who rushed for a conference-best 1,422 yards and 15 TDs... Ward set season-highs with 267 rushing yards and 4 TDs in the win at Southeast Missouri... Earned his first starting role as a junior in 2011, playing in 11 games (10 starts) along the O-line... Named second-team All-OVC after grading out between 86-90 percent in each contest... Led the Tigers O-line by averaging 6 "pancake" blocks per game... Helped pave the way for Ward, who had a team-high 978 rushing yards and 11 TDs... O-line helped block for an offense that produced 342 rushing yards and 2 TDs in the season-opening win against Southern... Appeared in eight games as a reserve during his sophomore campaign in 2010... Tigers finished second in the OVC averaging 190.0 rushing yards per contest, led by the dynamic RB tandem of Dante Thomas' (793 rushing yards and 6 TDs) and Preston Brown (760 rushing yards and 6 TDs)... Played in three contests as a redshirt freshman in 2009 after redshirting as a true freshman in 2008... Majored in human performance and sports science at Tennessee State... Prepped at White House (TN) HS, where he was named to both All-Regional and All-State teams... Was a finalist for Mr. Football as a 3A lineman.

COLLEGE: Florida HS: Corsicana (TX)

BORN: 12/18/89, Corsicana, TX

EXP. (NFL/RAVENS): Rookie

Omarius Hines signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13... Appeared in 51 career games (nine starts) at Florida, posting 64 receptions for 801 yards and 4 TDs... Had 323 rushing yards on 31 carries (10.1 avg.) and 4 TDs, marking the third-most rushing yards in school history by a WR (trailing only Percy Harvin - 1,852 yards and Wes Chandler - 356 yards)... As a senior in 2012, he recorded 242 receiving yards on 20 catches and 159 yards on 20 carries, scoring 2 rushing TDs... His 159 rushing yards rank as the fifth-most by a receiver in UF single-season history... Caught a career-long 52-yard pass from QB Jeff Driskel against Kentucky... Totaled multiple receptions in each of the last four games, posting 11 catches for 120 yards... Saw action in all but one game during his junior campaign (2011), totaling 7 receptions for 106 yards on the year... Recorded 3 catches against in-state rival Florida State for 15 yards... In Florida's 24-17 victory over Ohio State, led the team in receiving yards when he recorded 2 catches for 40 yards in the 2012 Gator Bowl... Appeared in all 13 games (seven starts) his sophomore season (2010), ranking sixth on the team with 20 receptions for 281 yards (14.1 avg.)... Gained 152 rushing yards on 12 carries (12.7 avg.), adding 2 rushing TDs... Had at least 1 reception in 10 of 13 games... Opened the scoring for the Gators with a 16-yard TD on an end-around in the second quarter against Penn State... Recorded 2 receptions for 27 yards in the Outback Bowl, including a 21-yarder... Tied his career high in receptions (4) against Georgia, totaling 50 yards in the game... Led the team in rushing against Mississippi State, posting 6 rushes for 58 yards and 1 TD, including a 31-yard rush in the fourth quarter... Rushing TD against MSU marked the first rushing score of his career and third-overall TD... Recorded 2 catches for 15 yards against Tennessee and executed a fake punt that produced 36 yards on a fourth-and-6 situation in the third quarter... Recorded his first-career start against South Florida, tallying 2 catches for 6 yards... Scored his second-career TD and Florida's first score of the 2010 campaign against Miami (OH) University in the season opener... As a redshirt freshman in 2009, finished sixth on the team in receptions (14) and receiving yards (172)... Had 1 catch for 4 yards vs. Alabama

in the SEC Championship Game...Had 4 catches for 50 yards and scored the first TD of his career on a 20-yard pass against Florida International...Notched 2 receptions for 20 yards and made 2 special teams tackles at South Carolina...Redshirted his true freshman season at UF in 2008...Graduated with an anthropology degree from Florida...Prepped at Corsicana (TX) HS, where he earned honorable mention Texas Class 4A All-State honors as a senior...Registered 824 yards and 13 TDs on 38 receptions, averaging over 21 yards per catch...Also rushed for 330 yards and 6 TDs...Caught 62 passes for 1,280 yards and 23 TDs as a junior...Earned first-team All-State and All-District honors as a junior...Also played basketball and ran cross country for Corsicana.

RUNNING BACK | 5-8 | 194

COLLEGE: Louisiana Tech HS: El Modena (Orange, CA)

BORN: 6/14/90, Santa Ana, CA

EXP. (NFL/RAVENS): Rookie

Ray Holley signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13...Saw action in 27 games at Louisiana Tech (transferred from Orange Coast College prior to the 2010 season) recording 227 rushing attempts for 1,090 yards and 13 TDs for the Bulldogs...Also pulled in 49 receptions for 451 yards and 1 TD...A second-team All-WAC selection that was named to the Capital One Academic All-America first-team (just the second player in program history to be named Academic All-America and the first to receive first team honors while also claiming Capital One Academic All-District first-team and Academic All-WAC honors as a senior in 2012...Finished the year with 142 carries for 740 yards (5.2 avg.) and 7 TDs (including a career-long 83-yard TD)...Also caught 34 passes for 324 yards and 1 TD...Rushed 14 times for 69 yards, matched a career high with 2 TDs and caught 2 passes for 13 yards in Tech's 44-38 win at Virginia...Recorded a career-high 176 all-purpose yards as he carried the ball 22 times for 139 yards (first-career 100-yard rushing game) and 1 TD, adding 4 receptions for 37 yards, in the 58-31 win against UNLV...Rushed for 130 yards and a TD on 12 carries, including a career-long 83-yard TD run at New Mexico State...Played in four games, carrying the ball 36 times for 144 yards and 4 TDs and caught 4 passes for 29 yards, before sustaining a season-ending back injury in 2011...Carried the ball 9 times for 49 yards and a career-best 2 TDs, and completed a 3-yard pass in Tech's 48-42 overtime win over Central Arkansas...Played in all 12 games, carrying the ball 49 times for 206 yards and 2 TDs as the team's second-leading rusher in 2010...Also caught 11 passes for 98 yards in his first season at Louisiana Tech...Made his Louisiana Tech debut against Grambling, rushing 5 times for 30 yards and making 3 catches for 26 yards...Transferred to Tech from Orange Coast College following the 2009 season...Named first-team All-SCFA after carrying the ball 311 times for 1,527 yards and 18 TDs at Orange Coast College in 2009...Averaged 145.7 yards per game as he set the school record for most carries in a season (311), most rushing yards in a season (1,457), most TDs in a game (5) and most yards in a game (266)...Was responsible for 75% of the team's TDs and 54.4% of the team's total offense...Named the Orange Coast College Male Athlete of the Year...Led the team with 464 rushing yards, while scoring 4 TDs in 2008...Also finished the season second on the team in receiving with 243 yards on 23 catches...Majored in sociology at Louisiana Tech...Prepped at El Modena (Orange, CA) HS, where he lettered in football and track and field...Two-time All-Century League selection, who was also named All-Orange County and was named the Century League offensive MVP in 2007...Ran for 2,047 yards on 232 carries and 31 TDs his senior year...Set the school record for most TDs in a game (6) and most in a season (31).

TIGHT END | 6-6 | 240

COLLEGE: Mississippi HS: Dutch Fork (Irmo, SC)

BORN: 4/24/90, Irmo, SC

EXP. (NFL/RAVENS): Rookie

Murphy Holloway signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13...A standout basketball player at Ole Miss, Holloway has not played football (WR) since his sophomore season of high school...Finished his basketball career as the school's all-time leading rebounder (1,093), also producing 1,476 points, 194 steals, 134 assists and 76 blocks...Posted 39 career double-doubles, as he averaged 11.2 points and 8.3 rebounds per game, seeing action in 132 contests (112 starts)... During his senior campaign in 2012, he became the 21st player in SEC history to record 1,400 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career...He finished the season ranking second on the team in scoring (14.5 ppg) and first in the SEC in rebounding (9.7 rpg)... Named to the All-SEC Tournament Team, tabbed an All-SEC first-team honoree (*NBCSports.com*) and a second-team All-SEC performer (coaches, *Associated Press*)...Started 35 of 36 games in his final season, he helped the Rebels post a 27-9 record, tying for the most wins in school history and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament...As a junior in 2011, he earned All-SEC honorable mention honors by the *AP*, after averaging 11.2 points per contest and team highs in rebounds (9.0), assists (1.4), steals (1.6) and minutes played (31.8) per game...Ranked third in the SEC with 11 double-doubles...Led the team in rebounding on 19 occasions and in scoring four times, also posting two 20-point scoring efforts...Named SEC Player of the Week after helping Ole Miss to wins over TCU (20 points) and Miami (13 points, season-high 17 rebounds)...Recorded double-figure rebounds in all three SEC Tournament games, including a 13-point, 13-board effort in the first-round win over Auburn...In May of 2010, he decided to transfer to South Carolina from Ole Miss...Redshirted the 2010-11 campaign, sitting out due to NCAA transfer rules, but then decided to transfer back to Ole Miss in May of 2011...Started 30 of his 34 games played for the Rebels as a sophomore, averaging 10.1 points, 7.6 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game...Ranked fifth among SEC players in rebounding and eighth in steals...Finished sixth in the SEC with eight double-doubles...Top game of the season came vs. Auburn in a 15-point, 20-rebound effort...The 20 rebounds were the most by a Rebel since 1975 and most by an SEC player in 2009-10...Played in all 31 games, receiving 17 starts as a freshman in 2008-09...Led Ole Miss and ranked 13th among SEC players in rebounding (6.6 rpg)...Averaged 8.4 points and 1.2 steals in 22 minutes per game, also tallying a team-best 36 steals...Posted six double-doubles on the season, seventh most in the SEC and second most among league freshmen... Majored in criminal justice at Ole Miss...Prepped at Dutch Fork (Irmo, SC) HS, where he earned South Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year honors, 4A Player of the Year and Mr. Basketball as a senior...Became the leading scorer in Dutch Fork history with 1,487 career points...MVP of the state tournament after leading the Silver Foxes to the semifinals...Averaged 28 points, 15 rebounds and 4 blocks as a senior...Registered 25 points and 13 boards per game as a junior.

EXP. (NFL/RAVENS): Rookie

Will Pericak signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent on 5/3/13...Started all 49 games of his Colorado career, setting a school record and a defensive record...Became the ninth defensive lineman to record 200-or-more tackles at Colorado by posting 207 stops (125 solo)...Also collected 19 TFL (-87 yards), 7.5 sacks (-46 yards), 4 FRs, 5 FFs and 8 PD...Posted 3 career blocked kicks...Was one of four captains and was voted an honorable mention All-Pac 12 performer as a senior in 2012... 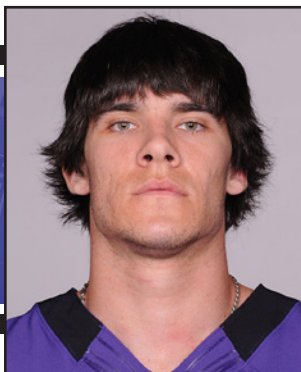
